SPEAKER:

Ruth Tooze, RN, BS, is the Supervisor of the Tualatin Client Care Monitoring Unit (CCMU), in the Long Term Care Quality Section of the Senior and Disabled Services Division (SDSD) of the Department of Human Services (DHS). (Whew!)

The Tualatin, Albany & Medford CCMUs support the elderly and disabled in Oregon long-term-care institutions by evaluating and monitoring quality of life and care in facilities statewide. The CCMUs perform federally mandated surveys for Medicare/Medicaid certification of long-term-care facilities and for state licensure of long-term-care and residential care facilities. These surveys are intended to ensure that care and services rendered to residents of these facilities are adequate and of appropriate quality. The Units also do complaint investigation of facility-wide problems.

Ruth's education and training were at Oregon State University and OHSU. Prior to her present position, she was a Public Health Nurse for Clackamas County, followed by work in a family-owned business, then as a staff surveyor for CCMU.

DIRECTIONS:

From I-205:

Take the SE Sunnyside Rd. exit and turn East (right from the South or left from the North). Continue on Sunnyside Rd. about a mile. Miramont Point is on the right, between 114th Ct. and 117th Ave., across from Valley View Evangelical Church. There is now a light at the intersection. If you come to the major intersection at 122nd, you'll know you've gone too far. Parking is limited so you may need to park in the church parking lot and walk down the hill to the meeting.
